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Purpose of CAP


Provide financial assistance to local governments in order to foster an integrated solid waste management system in a manner appropriate to the characteristics of the waste stream and thereby protect the state's land, air, water, and other natural resources and the public health.

Funding incentive

Example 1: A single county plans to build a 200-ton-per-day recycling and composting facility (50 percent funding).

• Eligible costs: \$6 million

Maximum grant: \$2 million

Example 2: A three-county solid waste commission plans to build a 300-ton-per-day waste-to-energy resource recovery facility (25 percent or \$2 million per participating county, whichever is less).

• Eligible costs: \$34 million

Maximum grant: \$ 6 million

Roadmap

- 1. CAP interest form is submitted to the MPCA.
- 2. CAP interest forms are evaluated to identify projects that best meet program objectives.
- 3. Potential grant applicants are selected and submitted to Minnesota Management and Budget (MMB) for funding consideration.
- 4. MMB works directly with the Governor's Office for statewide bonding initiatives.
- 5. When a project is funded under the CAP program the recipient of the award is legislatively-named.
