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

# Funding incentive

**Example 1:** A single county plans to build a 200-ton-per-day recycling and composting facility (50 percent funding).

- Eligible costs: \$6 million
- Maximum grant: \$2 million

**Example 2:** A three-county solid waste commission plans to build a 300-ton-per-day waste-to-energy resource recovery facility (25 percent or \$2 million per participating county, whichever is less).

- Eligible costs: \$34 million
- Maximum grant: \$ 6 million

1. CAP interest form is submitted to the MPCA.
2. CAP interest forms are evaluated to identify projects that best meet program objectives.
3. Potential grant applicants are selected and submitted to Minnesota Management and Budget (MMB) for funding consideration.
4. MMB works directly with the Governor's Office for statewide bonding initiatives.
5. When a project is funded under the CAP program the recipient of the award is legislatively-named.
