

Floodwood's own recycle center opens today at DAC

Starting this week, today (Friday) as a matter of fact, Floodwood has its own Recycling Collection Center, which will open each Friday at the Floodwood DAC in the parking lot on the north side of the Community Center building.

DAC director Ben Wright recently signed an agreement with the Brookston Solid Waste Commission to conduct recycling at the Center. As part of the agreement, the Brookston commission has helped set up the service, including providing a scale for weighing the material and bins to store the material in. A semi-trailer is also being provided for material storage. Also included, according to the agreement, is the provision of 16 man hours of training for the DAC staff in recycling.

In return, the DAC will conduct the recycling program at the Center each Friday, except holidays, between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.

The Floodwood Landfill Authority is also co-sponsoring the program along with the Brookston commission and the DAC.

The schedule of the present rates paid for recycleable materials at the collection center were published in an advertisement in The Forum last week. The ad should be

clipped out and saved for future reference. The advertisement has also been enlarged and posted around the community by the DAC to remind everyone of the new recycling program available here.

At present recycling is not mandatory, but a voluntary thing which will hopefully catch on and become a "lifestyle" before it does become mandatory. Area landfills are all making plans to close, and after that homeowners may eventually find it necessary to separate their recycleables or pay a premium to have it all hauled and separated for them.

By the way, the public notice (in last week's Forum) on the Floodwood Landfill planning to close as of March 1st, will probably be changed to a later date, according to Henry Raihala, a member of the regional committee working on the closings and the establishment of the collection center near Brookston. At the committee meeting Raihala attended along with George Johnston and Wilbur Ensey on Friday, the group learned that the county is reconsidering the closing date and will make a new announcement soon- probably depending upon how soon the collection center near Brookston is completed and ready for use. HOUSING NEWS

Bringing new housing to our city remains a priority for the City Council. We've recently applied to the St. Louis County Community Development Block Grant Program and were awarded \$15,000 to use toward the purchase of tax-forfeited lots to be used for housing.

Habitat for Humanity has identified families in the area who qualify for their program. Floodwood's first Habitat for Humanity Home is in the planning stages. We hope for this to be the first of several for our city.



The City has applied to the MN Housing Partnership to participate in its upcoming Housing Institute. The Housing Institute works with communities to develop creative solutions for bringing quality affordable housing to their communities. Four communities will be selected to participate in the program.

Western Lake Superior Habitat for Humanity is planning home builds in the City of Floodwood and is looking for candidate families for a new homes. They are looking to provide affordable homes for lower income families in the area. The desired income range for a family of 4 is roughly \$23,000 to \$46,000 a year, modified slightly by family size. LAND USE PERMIT REMINDER

The City of Floodwood requires land use permits for improvements to your property. New accessory structures, construction work to your home or accessory buildings, sidewalks, driveways, and demolition projects all require a land use permit. Demolition permits are issued free of charge. Work done without a permit is subject to double permit fees, plus a \$100.00 after-the-fact fee. 
