

Annual Most Endangered List & Sites Worth Saving
2014: Dissolved due to loss of buildings

Increased Work in Sustainability & Reuse:

- 2015: Facilitated the move of a small house for rehabilitation
- 2021: Bringing Down the House class focused on deconstruction. CE credit for realtors
- 2022:
 - 3-Course Deconstruction Masterclass
 - Funded in part by the National Trust for Historic Preservation
- 2023
 - Deconstruction professional joins Board of Directors
 - Hire Coordinator with experience in deconstruction





Rethos Education Program

Thoughtful preservation supports community resiliency

 The reduction of demolition and new construction keeps neighborhoods safe to inhabit

Redefining the Preservation Narrative

Preservation Policy
Changes that Can Reduce
Demolition



- Policy Challenge: Top Down or Grassroots designation process
- State Historic Tax Credit legislation for Commercial and Residential
 - Reduce the basis to enable more projects
- Incentivize the redirection of development to vacant parcels
 - Vacancy Tax on parcels that are left empty for more than specified period
 - Tax breaks for developers who build on existing vacant parcels
- Thoughtful rent stabilization that does not incentivize demolition
- Demolition Review to help stem demolition



Rethos is not Alone

A large number of historic preservation organizations are working to avoid demolition, including the National Trust for Historic Preservation and the National Preservation Partners Network.

Rethos is part of a growing field of preservation organizations across the country who see historic preservation as an important piece of the demolition problem.

Until the historic preservation field can expand public understanding of our field, we will continue to be thought of as an obstacle to reuse, deconstruction, and fighting climate change.
